# **Premises and Car Park**

These issues are still being discussed with our landlord, the local council and West Leicestershire Clinical Commissioning Group who are responsible for NHS premises provision in this area. A visit from the CCG took place on the 13<sup>th</sup> June. NHS England are in the process of writing a strategy document in order to assess the potential work required. It has been a difficult and frustrating process, but hopefully a positive result will be known by the end of this year. As you are aware the practice requires more consulting rooms and areas for patients to wait in, and the car park will require a major overall.

The Surgery requires us to raise much needed funds for the purchase of a Body Mass Machine and a Centrifuge. The cost of both is around £7000. Enquiries will be made to approach agencies regarding funding. However, Melissa, our Administration Supervisor, has spent many hours in

#### Patient Participation Group (PPG)

#### Changes to Repeat Prescription Ordering (3rd Party Ordering)

The way repeat prescriptions are ordered is changing. From <u>30<sup>th</sup> June 2019</u> you will have to order your repeat prescriptions directly through the Surgery, and not your High Street or Internet Pharmacy or appliance contractor. For certain patients 3<sup>rd</sup> party ordering can continue, i.e. Care Home Patients.
