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#### **Team News**

We said 'Goodbye' to our Practice Nurse, Rachel in August and have recruited a new nurse who will begin on 21/10/2019. Her name is Sandie and she is currently a District Nurse in Derbyshire.

#### **Premises and Car Park**

These issues are still being discussed. The Practice is now required to produce a more detailed plan of our requirements to present to West Leicestershire Clinical Commissioning Group (WLCCG) and NHS England. WLCCG along with their colleagues in East Leicestershire and the City, are preparing and Estates Strategy document which will be completed in December 2019 and once this has been done we will have a better indication as to how we might work with our premises to meet the increase demand to come with the new housing developments in this area. We remain confident of a positive outcome.

## **Fund Raising Day**

The Surgery still needs to continue to raise funds for the purchase of a Body Mass Machine and a Centrifuge. We would also like to explore the purchase the possibility of an external Defibrillator to be sited at the practice. The cost of all these items is in excess of £10000. #### 'Flu Vaccinations Clinic

As we head towards our 'flu season why not familiarise yourself with some useful 'flu facts versus fiction.

FICTION - The 'Flu jab give you flu.

FACT – The 'Flu jab cannot give you flu as it does not contain live viruses.

FICTION – a healthy diet and vitamin C will help prevent 'Flu.

FACT – 'Flu is a virus and can affect anyone, no matter how good your immune system.

FICTION – I've never had 'Flu so I am unlikely to get it.

FACT – The 'Flu virus mutates so you will require yearly vaccination to be protected.

Prevent yourself from becoming ill this 'Flu season and ensure you get your vaccination this year. It is worth it. 'Flu, pneumonia and shingle vaccinations will be held at the Surgery **on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2019.** Please contact reception to book in, or enquire about an alternative appointment for those who are eligible. As in the past there will be the opportunity to check your blood, cholesterol levels and weight should you wish.

#### **MMR Vaccine Overview**

MMR is a safe and effective combined vaccine that protects against 3 separate illnesses – measles, mumps and rubella (German measles) – in a single injection. The full course of MMR vaccination requires 2 doses. Measles, mumps and rubella are highly infectious conditions that can have serious, potentially fatal complications, including meningitis, swelling of the brain (encephalitis) and deafness. This can also lead to complications in pregnancy that affect the unborn baby, and can lead to miscarriage. Since the MMR vaccine was introduced in 1988, it is rare for children in the UK to develop these serious conditions. However, outbreaks happen and there have been cases of measles ion recent years, so it is important to make sure that YOU and YOUR CHILDREN are up to date with MMR vaccination. #### **Local Area Coordinators**
